Through volunteerism and community outreach, our employees help strengthen local organizations and support neighbors in meaningful ways.

When employees volunteer, the Bank amplifies their impact by providing a matching financial contribution to the charity. AgriBank also matches employees' charitable gifts to nonprofit organizations, up to \$750 per year, further enhancing support for community partners.

In addition, employees serve on the AgriBank Gives Back committee, helping direct corporate grants and promote volunteer initiatives that make a lasting difference across the region.





COMPANY GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS: STRENGTHENING OUR COMMUNITIES

TWIN CITIES AREA CHARITABLE GIVING

AgriBank supports charitable organizations across Minnesota's Twin Cities metro area, investing in nonprofits that strengthen and serve local communities.

Our giving spans a broad range of organizations, with a strong focus on those providing essential housing, food and general welfare services to individuals and families in need. This includes nonprofits addressing urgent needs such as emergency shelter and prepared meals, as well as organizations offering clothing, packaged foods and supplies for transitional housing.

AgriBank also prioritizes support for organizations that create opportunities for youth in agricultural and financial education. Investing in the next generation helps engage potential future employees and gives AgriBank employees meaningful opportunities to share their experiences and knowledge with students.

AgriBank is proud to continue its Culture Awards program. Each year, we recognize five employees who embody one of the Bank's culture characteristics: Mission, Integrity, Excellence, Support or Improvement. AgriBank also makes a donation on behalf of each award winner to the nonprofit organization of their choice.

To honor employees' length of service, AgriBank gives employees the opportunity to choose a nonprofit organization to receive a donation in their name when they reach their 25-year and 35-year anniversaries.

RURAL COMMUNITY GRANT FUND



In North Dakota, AgriBank partners with two local Farm Credit lenders — AgCountry Farm Credit Services and Farm Credit Services of Mandan — to provide grants that support communities impacted by mineral development in the Bakken region. Over the years, the Rural Community Grant Fund has awarded \$8.5 million in grants for infrastructure improvements, development initiatives, hospitals and clinics, equipment, training and other support for emergency responders, schools and additional projects that strengthen local communities.

KERI VOTRUBA FUTURE OF FARMING ENDOWMENT

AgriBank established the Keri Votruba Future of Farming endowment in partnership with the Nebraska FFA Foundation. The endowment, named for a former AgriBank board chair, recognizes students who complete a Supervised Agricultural Experience in crop production, livestock production or beef production through the Nebraska FFA Association's proficiency award program.

COLLINS SCHOLARSHIP

AgriBank partners with Agriculture Future of America (AFA) each year to award the William J. Collins scholarships, which support the development of future agricultural leaders. The \$2,000 scholarships—named in honor of a former AgriBank CEO—are awarded to children of Farm Credit employees within the AgriBank District who plan to pursue careers in an agriculture related field or a future occupation in rural America.

NATIONAL FARM CREDIT GRANTS

In addition to our charitable programs, AgriBank contributes to Farm Credit's national contributions program, which supports organizations that cultivate the next generation of agricultural leaders through education, safety, inclusion and hands-on learning across the food, agriculture and rural communities they serve. These organizations include AFA, FFA, the Holstein Foundation, the Indigenous Food and Agriculture Initiative, MANRRS, National 4H, National Ag in the Classroom, the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge and the Progressive Agriculture Foundation.

Under Farm Credit's cooperative structure, AgriBank is primarily owned by local Farm Credit Associations, which provide financial products and services to rural communities and agriculture.
